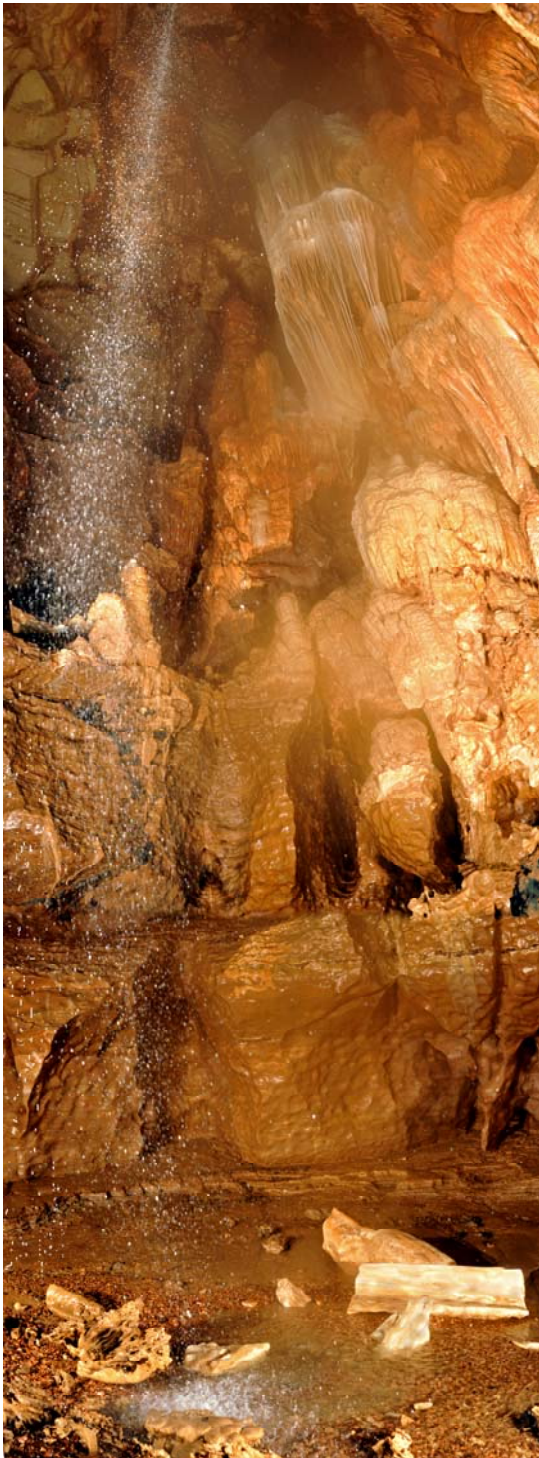


**25th Annual Ennis Cave Blowout
Memorial Day Weekend
May 26 to June 1, 2010
Mountain View, Stone County, Arkansas**

Please join the Ennis Cave Family of Cavers to celebrate 25 great years of Ennis Cave stewardship and friendship. How things have changed. 25 years ago the entrance to the cave was filled in by 40 vertical feet of wet gravel and clay. It took several thousand man hours and the dedication of over 100 cavers from every corner of the US to open the cave up to where it is today. Not to mention the great work Tim McClain has done making the cave safer and more accessible.

This event will be first come first serve for the camping. Naturally we will accommodate special requests to the best of our ability. If you plan on bring a camper or if you desire more privacy let us know. There are approximately 100 established campsites available plus as much primitive camping as needed. There will be 2 showers, two small shelter houses, and plenty of toilets and running water throughout the upper half of the campground. The big pavillion is being expanded to accommodate more people. Remember the hiking boots as there are many miles of trails around the cave for foot travel or by ATV.

There will be live music and a large banquet dinner Sat. night, caveman breakfast Sunday morning, and happy hours in the sinkhole Friday and Sunday evening, PLUS a musical talent night Sunday night. Additionally there will be guided cave trips to varies areas of the cave with some trips catering to kids or families, some to photography, and some for sport. There is something for everyone. Please remember the entrance to the cave is via a 45 foot long large sloped culvert pipe with a ladder inside. It is easy to traverse with lots of room.



Basic Registration is \$25.00 and includes the live music, showers, toilets, ice, fire wood, trash service, dinner Sat night and breakfast Sunday morning, and raffle. Camping and caving are always free. T-Shirts will be \$20 each. The Banquet dinner and breakfast is potluck so bring a side dish. Everything else will be provided. Festivities will include raffles, cavers award presentations, and kid games/prizes.

Early reservations are recommended. Volunteers to lead cave trips are also welcomed. Please come and enjoy some time with old friends and make a few new ones in the process!

Cave trips will be lead to the 100 foot waterfall, Avenue E, Downstream, the Maze, Cairn Room/Lon O'Dell Lost Passage and Timbukto. Other trips may include the Blow Hole, Campsite Passage, and Taj Mel Hall.

There will be live music Sat. night as well as the traditional bonfire. Sunday night bring your instrument and voice and come for a talent jam around the bonfire.

Don't forget to bring a chair and your cocktail and join your friends in the sinkhole for a cool happy hour in the sinkhole Friday and Sunday early evening before the sun goes down.

There is a small store about 5 miles away that has your basics. Mt View is the nearest town and has a Wal-Mart and many places to eat. Stone County is a dry county so plan accordingly as it is about 4 hour roundtrip drive if you need any spirits!

Blanchard Springs Cavers is about 45 minutes away and the White River access about 2 miles.
